## IT'S FROM HIM AND FOR HIM

## Galatians 1:1-5

# I. CALLED BY JESUS vv. 1-2

- A. Paul starts off by stating his call.
  - 1. He is an apostle. (Sent "from" and sent "to")
  - 2. We see this emphasis from Paul that his calling was not from men.
  - 3. Notice the unity of Jesus Christ and God the Father.
- B. He also notes that he's not alone.
  - 1. Again, the Apostle Paul often noted that he was accompanied by other brothers and sisters.
  - 2. He wasn't a lone wolf, preaching himself, but there were other believers in fellowship with him that acknowledged His call.
  - 3. Red flags should go up all over the place if we encounter a Christian who has disconnected himself from everyone else.
- C. He withholds the word "saints" for the Galatian churches.
  - 1. This was his regular practice to include "saints" when he sent letters to the other churches.
  - 2. "Saint" from the Greek word "hagios" means "holy" or "morally pure".
  - 3. Because of the perverted Gospel they were following. He questions their righteousness.

## II. BLESSINGS FROM JESUS v.3

- A. He speaks the blessings of grace and peace.
  - 1. This is a sign that he is personally filled with grace and peace.
  - 2. "Grace" from the Greek word "charis" means "unmerited favor" or "gift".
  - 3. "Peace" from the Greek word "eirene" is "peace" coupled with "quietness, rest and prosperity".

- B. This is his ultimate goal in the letter.
  - 1. Even though he is angry with them, he doesn't lose his fondness for them.
  - 2. He even refers to them as his little children. Galatians 4:19
- C. He adds the words "our Lord" to Jesus Christ.
  - 1. "Lord" from the Greek word "kurios" meaning "supreme ruler".
  - 2. Paul is emphasizing that it is all about Jesus and our relationship with Him. Romans 10:9
  - 3. There is a focus on getting their eyes back onto Jesus and who He is.

#### III. DELIVERED BY JESUS v.4

- A. We are living in an evil age.
  - 1. Even non-Christians will acknowledge that there is evil in the world all around us.
  - 2. That evil comes from Satan. John 10:10
  - 3. It also comes from man's own selfish desires.
- B. It is the work of Christ that brings deliverance.
  - Christ not only died for our sins, but He died that we might be delivered from the world of sin now. John 17:15-16
  - 2. We once walked in darkness, but now we walk in light. Ephesians 5:8
  - 3. Now, when tempted we are always provided a way of escape. 1 Corinthians 10:13
- C. Jesus did this by the will of God.
  - 1. Paul emphasizes that it is God's divine purpose and plan for us to find deliverance.
  - 2. Jesus told us that anything He did was because the Father directed Him to do so. John 6:38
  - And within that will was that we might find deliverance and freedom from the chains of this world.

# IV. GLORY TO JESUS v.5

- A. All of the glory goes to Jesus.
  - 1. This leads us back to the fact that Jesus gets all the credit.
  - 2. Paul wants to make sure they pay attention to the true Gospel and the true source of the message which is Jesus.
  - 3. There is an ongoing tendency for Christians to slip into a works-oriented salvation.
- B. It is to never be shared with others.
  - 1. We always need to be careful about attempting to receive glory for ourselves. 1 Peter 4:11
  - 2. It's good to honor those who have blessed us in our walk, just don't glorify them as a Savior.
  - 3. Men are not built to receive the glory intended for God.
- C. "Amen" means "so let it be" or "firmly established".
  - 1. He wanted to make sure that this core message was rooted deeply within them.
  - 2. The first part of this letter was a reminder and a return to the true message of the gospel.
  - 3. It is from this point forward that Paul begins to hit them hard regarding the deception into which they had fallen.
